Fife Play Practice Development Team

The Play Practice Development Team is based within the Early Years Team, Education Directorate. Established in 2012, our primary focus is to support play development across Fife to improve children's outcomes through play. This recognises the role play has in child development and in the development of physical and mental health and wellbeing.

Scotland's National Play Strategy (2013) acknowledges that children's play is crucial to Scotland's wellbeing and that play is an essential part of a happy, healthy childhood and fundamental to children and young people's quality of life.

Contributing to this by supporting play development across Fife, we promote and develop play opportunities based on Playwork practice that is focussed on free play, outdoor play, and the play process, underpinned by the Playwork Principles and the child's right to play, enshrined in the United Nations Convention of the Rights of the Child.

Free Range Project

The Free Range Project is a targeted, referral based outdoor play project based at Falkland Estate. The aim of the project is to improve children's quality of life through outdoor play. It is an entirely outdoor free play experience for children aged 4-10 years and aims to increase children's confidence and resilience by providing challenge and adventurous play for vulnerable children from identified areas of Fife during school holiday periods. Over 1600 children have attended the project since 2012.

Promoting Learning at Home

'I use it when looking for just some basic learning activities within in my setting, the app is full of simple, free and low cost activities. A favourite we done lately was bubble play and washing all our animals'

'We link the 50 things activities to our weekly planning and promote activities based on the children's interests, learning and stage of development'

'We try and co-ordinate activities around what the children are currently learning in the playroom or making links to activities within the local community, such as our new railway link'

'We promote and link to PEEP themes'

Engaging Families

'Simple, interactive activities where the resources are easily accessed at home. From verbal feedback the families enjoyed "Hocus Pocus Potions"

'Many of my families have more than 1 child, they like the activities that are age appropriate for both their children'

'It does not only promote all areas of the curriculum but also promotes community cohesion at the same time'

'Almost all our families have downloaded the app now and have been very interested in how it works. From our Seesaw initiative we have had around 30% of families participate in the activities shared. These have been added into their child's PLJ. Play Away 2 group was a success with families keen to try different activities with their child each week to add to their memory box'
