# Welcome!

You will be aware by now that the Council decided to declare a Housing Emergency in March and since then we have been working hard with our partners, other Council Services, the Tenants Forum, Housing Associations and the voluntary sector to define how we respond to that Emergency. The Council's Cabinet Committee agreed a high-level Housing Emergency Action Plan with a further report due back to Committee in September.

My in box on a daily basis is dominated by tenants and housing applicants asking when I am going to get a house from the Council. That is a very difficult question for me to answer. It is taking far too long for anyone to get a formal offer of a house or flat and people are waiting in sometimes unacceptable housing conditions for an offer of housing. That is unacceptable here in Fife. We are facing an extreme housing shortage and the only way to address that is for the Council and our Housing Association Partners to keep building affordable housing. This will take time. As short-term actions, we are reducing the number of council empty properties and seeking to turn them around in fewer days. The Council is also focussed on trying to move people out of bed & breakfast and hotels that we are using increasingly for temporary homeless accommodation.

The Council is committed to making it easier to access all housing options in Fife and we will be bringing forward additional plans to do that over the course of the next 1-3 years.

In the face of massive cuts to the Housing Budget, I had to look at all the facts and I declared a Housing Emergency on 21st March. We are formulating a 3-year Housing Emergency Action Plan for 2024-2027, to tackle Fife's Housing Emergency.

We are looking at 3 main high-level themes:-

1 – Boosting Affordable Housing Supply, 2 - Making best use of existing properties and 3 – Enhancing Housing access and prevention of homelessness

We need to ensure that all stakeholders, especially tenants are at the table to influence how to identify the issues and look at ways to mitigate them. The best way for you to do this, is to have you say is through your local Tenants and Residents Association. Scan the QR code to see if you have a TRA in your area or email the Tenant Participation Team tenantparticipation@fife.gov.uk and they will advise you if you have a TRA in your area, or assist you to set up a TRA. My door is always open and I look forward to hearing from your TRAs, as we progress. Remember that your voice matters need to hear your ideas big or small. it's often the smallest ideas that affect the biggest changes.

# Highlands and Islands Bin Stores renewed

### New bin stores have helped to revamp the Highland and Islands Area of Kirkcaldy.

Through consultation with Tenants and Residents Shetland, Orkney, Sutherland and Caithness Place have seen the area improved with the recent fitting of new bin store doors in all blocks. This has helped make the buildings more secure for residents and allow all rubbish to be safely stored away until cleared by the recycling team on bin day. This has helped with preventing littering in the area.

Previously the doors were damaged and in a bad condition with no security locks. This was causing various issues within the estate however the installation of the new doors have created a brighter, safer environment for everyone making the area more welcoming.

# **Improvements at Buchanan Court**

The Buchanan Court improvements came about following improvements at Forth View which left Buchanan Court next door looking a little grey in comparison. Fencing work had taken place as part of an opportunity fund bid at Forth View previously but there was no colour to the area. In Buchanan Court there is a mix of sheltered and mainstream tenancies and the Retirement Housing Officer had suggested that the sheltered housing tenants would like to have some planters to add some colour to the area, from here the idea came to have a mural. A meeting was held at the Philp Hall with all Buchanan Court tenants and residents invited. The suggestion was to do a mural on the side of the fence that the flats looked out on to along with some planters and some new planting at the communal grassed areas.

An opportunity fund bid was successful for financial year 23/24 and work was completed in March 2024 just as we were coming out of winter and into spring. The tenants and residents have given the improvements lots of positive feedback and it has brightened up a once dull area with the colours of the flower meadow scene in the mural and the planting.

Local children also gave a petition for modern and safe play spaces to local Cllr Margaret Kennedy.




# Estate Improvements completed in Rolland Avenue

In a previous edition last year, it was highlighted that the wall at Rolland Avenue, East Wemyss needed repairs. Not only aesthetically but also from a safety aspect. Over the last Year the Housing team have been working hard to ensure this project is complete and can create a cleaner and safer environment for all tenants and residents.

Mark Moir Housing Management Officer explained; "The walls are now completed making them structurally sound and looking much better. The next phase of the projects is still being worked out but we're looking at the roughcasting and the footpaths. New bow top fencing was also installed as seen in the pictures giving safe access to the shared drying greens and garden areas."





# **Dunfermline Estate Walkabouts**

It is important for Housing Services to liaise with our tenants and communities about projects or improvements in our Estates. The Dunfermline Area team have focussed on carrying out community led estate walkabouts following the start of the new financial year in April.

The purpose of a walkabout is to bring Council Services together with people in the community to create an action plan. The Housing Management Officer (HMO) together with the Tenants & Residents Association (TRA), if the area has one, identify a suitable time and place for everyone to meet. The HMO invites colleagues from Grounds Maintenance, Safer Communities, Transportation, Police Scotland and Elected Members to attend and give their input. The group walk through the community and discuss ideas and identify any issues. The HMO will create an action plan and give actions to relevant Services, the document and any progress updates can be followed up at TRA meetings.

Many improvements have been made through estate walkabouts, these can range from untidy gardens being cleaned up, new bins being sited, dog fouling patrols to much larger projects such as new parking areas or lock up demolitions.

The Dunfermline Area has so far carried out walkabouts with BASICSIM TRA (Abbeyview), Cleish Area TRA, Leishman Drive and Halkett Crescent TRA, Brucefield TRA and in the Headwell Avenue & Bellyeoman areas. Each walkabout has been well attended and has an action plan created, thank you to all residents who have joined us or given feedback.

# Trust in Fife's mindfulness garden

### Taking positive steps to assist vulnerable and homeless people in Fife...

Trust in Fife is a charity which provides housing and homelessness services within our local community.

Trust in Fife has two temporary accommodation projects: the Oasis Project and the Valley Accommodation Unit. These projects are for single people aged 16 – 60 who are experiencing homelessness. Both units offer housing support to assist individuals to sustain future accommodation.

Trust in Fife introduced mindfulness sessions with Be Mindful Fife. Sessions are available for residents and exresidents of both homeless units.

Trust in Fife aimed to develop a reflective and peaceful outdoor area. They successfully applied to the B&Q Foundation to create a mindfulness garden in the grounds of the Oasis Project. A redundant area of land was identified, and work began. Staff and residents painted fences and benches, built furniture, and chose plants. Planting aims to be finished by Spring 2024. Trust in Fife also offer other services, including:

- Fife Private Rental Solutions (FPRS)
- Fife's ethical letting agency helps people access the private rented sector. The team also work with landlords and letting agencies to support tenancy sustainment and prevent homelessness.

#### **Cairn Centre**

Charity shop at 81 Dunnikier Road, Kirkcaldy which sells pre-owned furniture, clothes, electrical items, books and bric-a-brac. All profits help local people experiencing homelessness.

# **Dog Watch Fife**

### Do you have a dog and require a dog walker that is 'approved'?

Fife Council Safer Communities Team runs a voluntary "approved user" accreditation scheme called Fife Dog Watch, for professional dog walking companies.

Professional dog walkers provide a valued service to busy working people, the elderly and infirm. Currently, professional dog walkers are unregulated, and do not require licences or formal registration, to operate. The Fife Dog Watch initiative looks to ensure that professional dog walkers who join the initiative have relevant knowledge, adequate insurance, suitable vehicles and adopt an acceptable code of practice, giving dog owners reassurance that their dog is in safe hands.

# Take The Lead

# Do you know that there are approximately 12 million pet dogs in the UK, meaning 31% of households own at least one dog?

Many dog owners and walkers who visit Fife's countryside, woodlands, parks and beaches are considerate and responsible, however the minority aren't, allowing dogs to foul, and roam free.

Fife Council Safer Communities Team and Police Scotland have joined up with other partners to ask all dog walkers to 'Take the Lead' and to keep their pets on lead and under control when out and about.

Fife has many great places to walk your dog and we want people who own a dog or are looking to own a dog in Fife to take responsibility by:

- Keeping their dog on the lead in the countryside, particularly when near livestock.
- · Being aware that any dog can become a danger to animals and wildlife.
- $\cdot$  Always picking up and bagging their dog's poo.
- $\cdot$  Never letting their dog approach any animal or human uninvited
- $\cdot$  Sticking to designated paths to ensure animals and birds remain undisturbed

We are taking our message around Fife by attending popular dog walking areas where we can speak and

# Fife Private Rental Solutions (FRPS)

Trust in Fife, a local homeless charity, launched Fife Private Rental Solutions as the first ethical letting agent in Fife. They work to prevent homelessness and help people access and sustain accommodation in the private rented sector.

FPRS have launched their new website: www. fifeprivaterentalsolutions.co.uk The website supports prospective tenants, tenants, landlords and letting agents.

FPRS offer a full range of services:

### **For tenants**

FPRS offer free services including:

- General advice and guidance
- Help with tenancy sustainment
- Issue resolution and tenancy assistance
- Rent resolution
- Advanced income maximisation
- Deposit assistance services

### **For landlords**

FPRS offer paid services - from one-off services to let only and full property management services. As a nonprofit agency, rates are competitive. Free services are also available including general advice and guidance, issue resolution and tenancy assistance, landlord and tenant mediation, and rent resolution.

### **For letting agents**

FPRS have created a free bespoke service to help tenants sustain their tenancy. The team can help with tenancy assistance, advanced income maximisation, rent resolution, agent and tenant mediation and deposit assistance.

Caroline McCall, CEO for Trust in Fife says: "Since our registration as a letting agent in September 2023, the team have been working hard to build a new website to promote services. They have created and launched new services to help people in Fife who live in the private rented sector to sustain their accommodation and prevent homelessness. The team also support landlords and letting agents to do the same. FPRS will do all it can to make the private rented sector a long term, sustainable, and affordable housing option."

### A new service

FPRS offer a deposit assistance service where the team can access cash funds to help pay a deposit. This can pay a partial or full deposit and includes getting this lodged in a deposit scheme.

#### **Success stories**

The Advanced Income Maximisation service can help increase the income of clients in a private let or looking to obtain a private let. Since this service began, the team have assisted 24 people to backdate benefits to the value of £55,722.60 and 39 people have experienced an increase in their monthly benefits to the value of £17,119.63.

### **Rent Resolution**

The Rent Resolution Service can assist if a private tenant falls into rent arrears. This includes mediation, manageable payment plans, and sourcing grants to clear arrears and keep the tenant in the property. Anne joined the board of the Fife Federation of Tenants and Residents Associations in July 2016 and her wealth of knowledge and experience will be hard to replace.

Anne was also the Chair of the Tenant Led Scrutiny Panel, looking at different parts of the Housing Service, with the other tenant's, to ensure that the Housing Service are delivering on what they should, within timescales, whilst ensuring that it was done achieving value for money. A report of their findings and recommendations are then passed onto Fife Council for consideration and implementation.

Anne was well known and respected by the Community, Housing staff, managers and Elected Members alike. A memorial cherry tree was planted in memory of Anne by the Community, to remember her.

John Mills – Head Of Housing Services - " During my 40 years of housing service to the Local Authority in Fife, I have had the privilege of working with several colleagues from the Tenants Movement that have been champions for tenants' interests. Anne was one of those people. She always told it as she and other tenants saw it and ensured that council officers like me listened and acted where we could to improve housing and tenant conditions in Fife. She was a pioneer of Tenant Scrutiny and Chaired the first tenant panel in Fife. I recall working closely with Anne on the regeneration of Golfdrum Street in Dunfermline and together we brought improvement to the housing stock in the street. She will be sadly missed at FFOTRA and by me."



## Helping the community survive the current cost of living crisis

Golfdrum Street Tenants & Residents Association in Dunfermline held a community event in association with Kingdom Community Bank which was designed to help people to explore the cost of living crisis and to find ways to save money.

Douglas Millar, Chair of the TRA, said that prior to the event there was some scepticism that the event would make any real difference but by the end of the 2 hour session these views were proved to be wrong. In what proved to be a most enjoyable event, those attending were quickly reassured that everyone was finding that their bills had increased significantly over the last couple of years and that all attendees had changed their shopping habits and had found innovative ways to make ends meet. It wasn't just the advice from Kingdom Community Bank that people found helpful but it was the discussions with other participants where ideas and tips on how to save money were shared. Top tips included:-

- Using supermarket clubcards etc. to get maximum savings where possible.
- Shopping around and not always buying branded products.
- Using the airfryer instead of the oven wherever possible.
- Only buy what you need instead of things you might want.
- Making a shopping list and sticking to it was the key to saving and having some money left for those much needed family treats.

The highlight of the event was undoubtedly the "taste test" where all participants tried to identify the branded product compared to the cheap supermarket alternative. Perhaps not unsurprisingly, the branded product didn't always win!

The first event ever to be held in the Nursery was a multi activity event held on Saturday 11th May consisting of a litter pick, car boot and craft sale. 
# Logo competition

My main interests are reading, gardening and history. I am currently researching my family tree and putting my rather overgrown garden to rights.


I have created a wee rose garden in memory of past family members and friends.


