Clue 2:

Meander your way down to this award-winning beachfront, if you are a real beachcomber you will find our next clue easily.

Clue 3:

As you continue your quest, take a leisurely stroll along the Promenade to the west enjoying the refreshing sea breeze and stunning views of the coast while hunting for the next clue. Head to the town's newest addition where your next clue awaits at its platform.

Clue 4:

Your journey will then lead you to the town's industrial park where old stations adorned with vintage signs and bygone locomotives. Why not take some time while visiting this site and let the children play in the new play park. Keep an eye out for our next clue.

Clue 5:

From Leven Heritage Railway, make your way to the part of town that once was the hub for the old Leven Railway. Here you will find our next clue at the Centre.

Clue 6:

Continue your search to Leven Library where details of your last clue await.

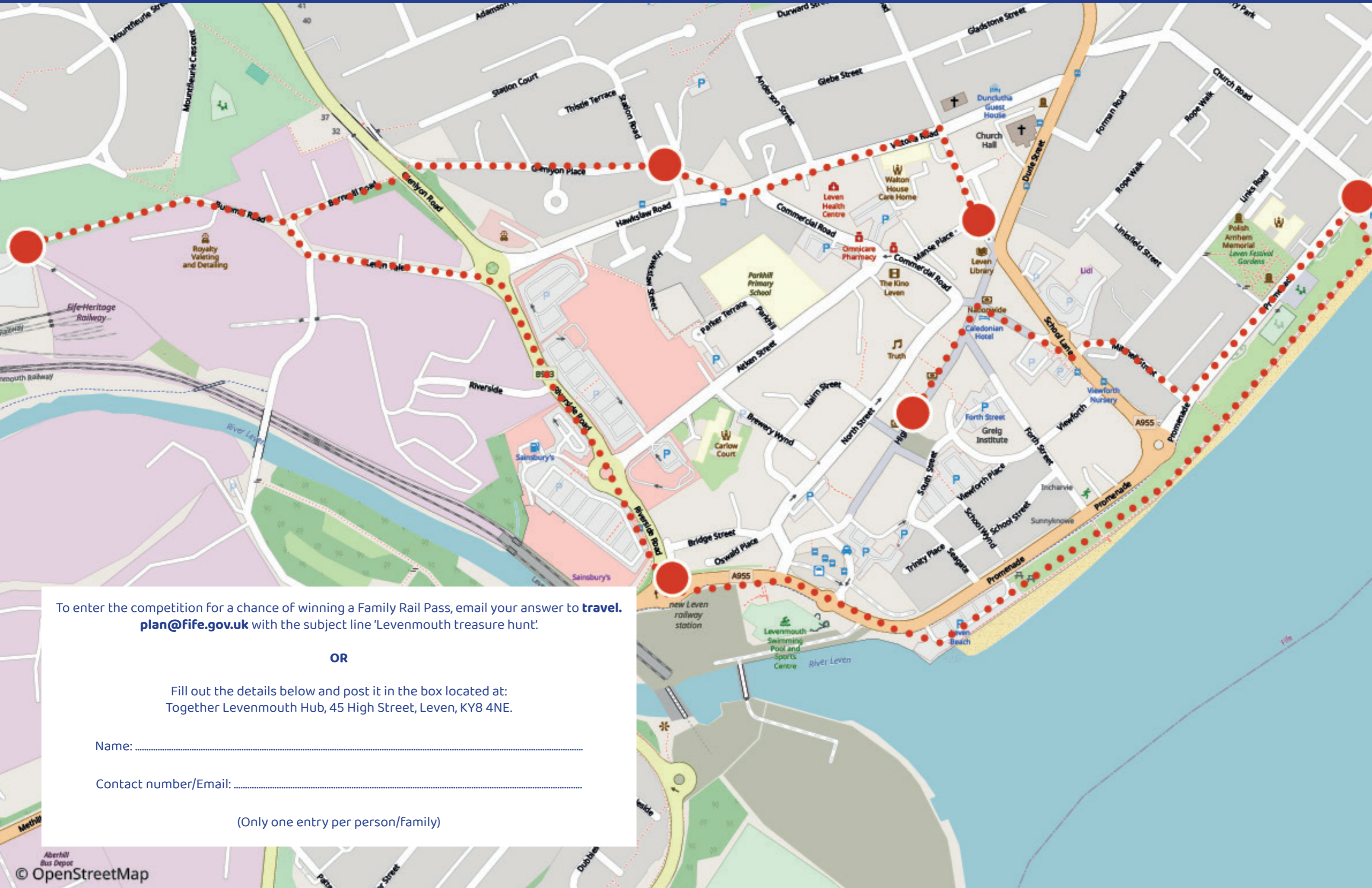

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METHIL & BUCKHAVEN

Embark on an adventure through the rich history and cultural landmarks of these charming towns. Collect all the numerical or alphabetical clues at each point which will help you unravel the mystery of this trail, numerical clues e.g $2+0+2+4 = 8$, 8th letter of the alphabet is H.

Clue 1:

Your journey will start where the new railway line will begin or end. Here your first clue awaits.

Clue 2 :

Continue your journey through Lower Methil, passing the once vibrant docks to the place that once was the old post office, but now contains memories of a bygone past. Here you will find our late Kings monograms – remove the first digit of the date to reveal your second letter.

Clue 3:

Next, make your way along the town to what once was the National Bar, a historic watering hole frequented by locals and visitors alike that sits along the old Station Road. Look for the clue hidden among the pub's traditional exterior décor; it is the letter within the letter that we are looking for.

Clue 4:

Continue your journey to Memorial Gardens, a peaceful oasis dedicated to those who have served their country. Search for the next clue near the central monument it is hidden within the dates. Removing the repetitive numbers will help you find the next clue.

Clue 5:

Your journey continues along Wellesley Road passing by the White Swan Hotel, which was built in 1906. During an excavation of the foundations a bronze age cemetery containing a dozen graves was found. Do you know how our ancestors created Bronze? Add the first letters of these elements to your clues.

Clue 6:

Head towards Randolph Wemyss Hospital, a historic institution that has provided care to the community for generations. Your clue lies within its turrets. Count them to find your next letter.

Clue 7:

Learn about the brave deeds of Robert Dunsire VC, a local hero honoured for his valiant actions in battle. Search near his memorial in Toll Park to uncover the clue to his birth year.

Clue 8:

Continue into Buckhaven where it is claimed that its resident are largely descendants of those Norseman who made it their homes in the 9th century. Pop into "The Hub" and discover how local volunteers are creating a greener space for all in Levenmouth. Your next letter awaits.

Clue 9:

Your next and final clue takes you to the site that once housed the old railway signal box in Starkies Woods. Stop and read the history of the regeneration of this only woodland in Buckhaven, your clue is clear, it is defined by the first number of the year the project started.

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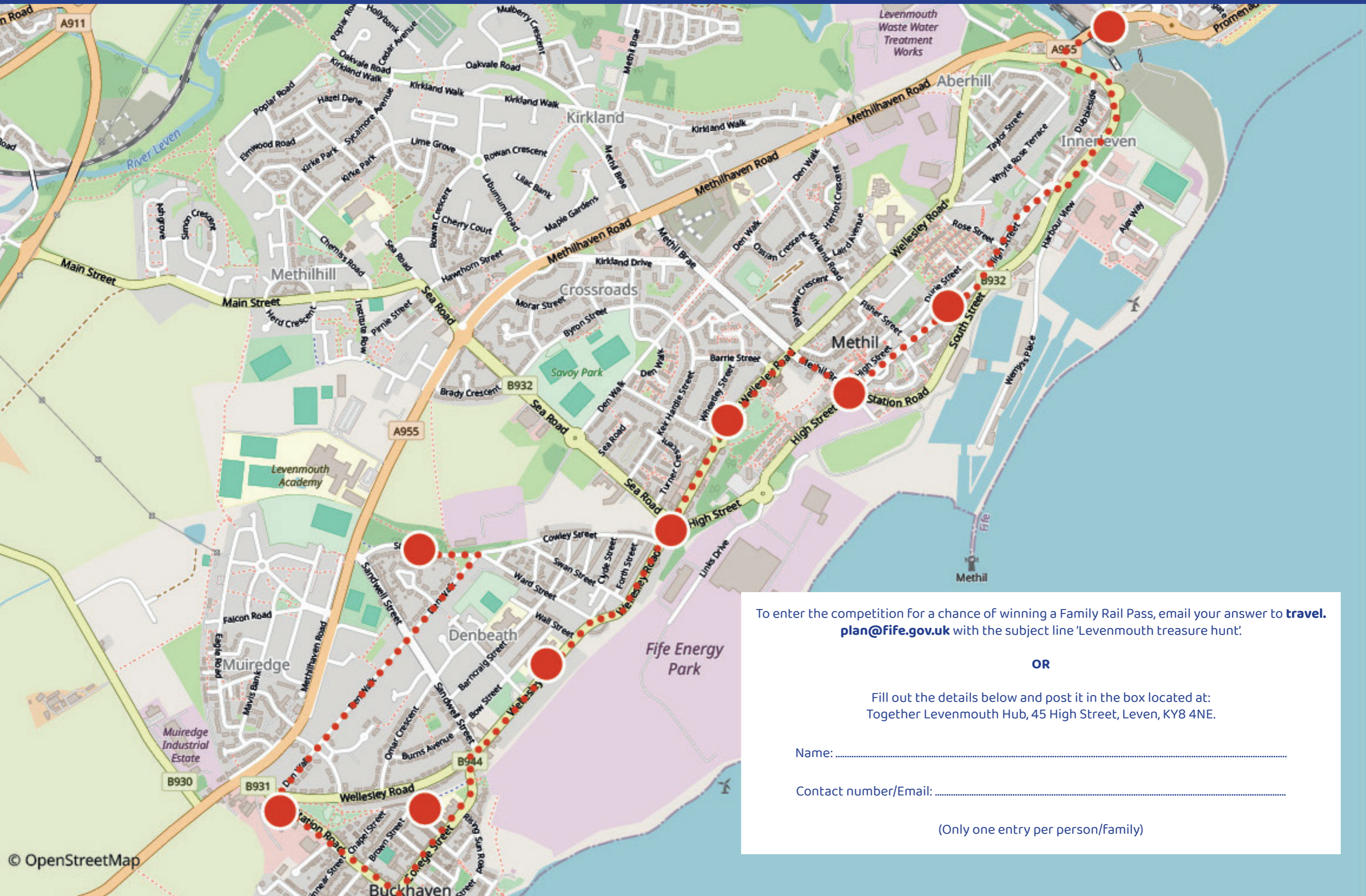
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KENNOWAY

Welcome to the Kennoway Treasure Hunt! Prepare to explore the hidden treasures and fascinating landmarks of this village. Collect all the numerical or alphabetical clues at each point which will help you unravel the mystery of this trail, numerical clues e.g $2024 = 2+0+2+4 = 8$, 8th letter of the alphabet is H.

Your starting point is where Kennoways History is unveiled.

Clue 1:

In a land where stones glide on ice, find the place where players were precise. Seek the board that tells the tale, your next clue is in the detail. The 3rd number of this sports birth is your next clue.

Clue 2:

"In honour of those who came before, a garden of memories, lore, and more. The number of wars signified by poppies will provide your next clue.

Clue 3:

"Seek the place of peace and prayer, where St. Kenneth watches in quiet care. Near a stone of age-old lore, your next clue hides, but there's much more. The number of years between these dates, is where your next clue awaits.

Clue 4:

"Nature's embrace, a hidden space, follow the stream's gentle pace. In The Den where shadows play, on the Totem Pole, your clue will lay." Take note of the last digit of this important date, you may need this later on.

Clue 5:

Swan your way to the path where Pilgrims once trod and lights of old lead the way. While walking the Old Pilgrims Way take note of the number of historic lamps. These two digits added together =, add this to the digit from the previous clue. This will give you, your next letter.

Clue 6:

End your adventure where wheels spin and tracks wind, at a place where cyclists and skaters find their grind. Your final clue awaits.

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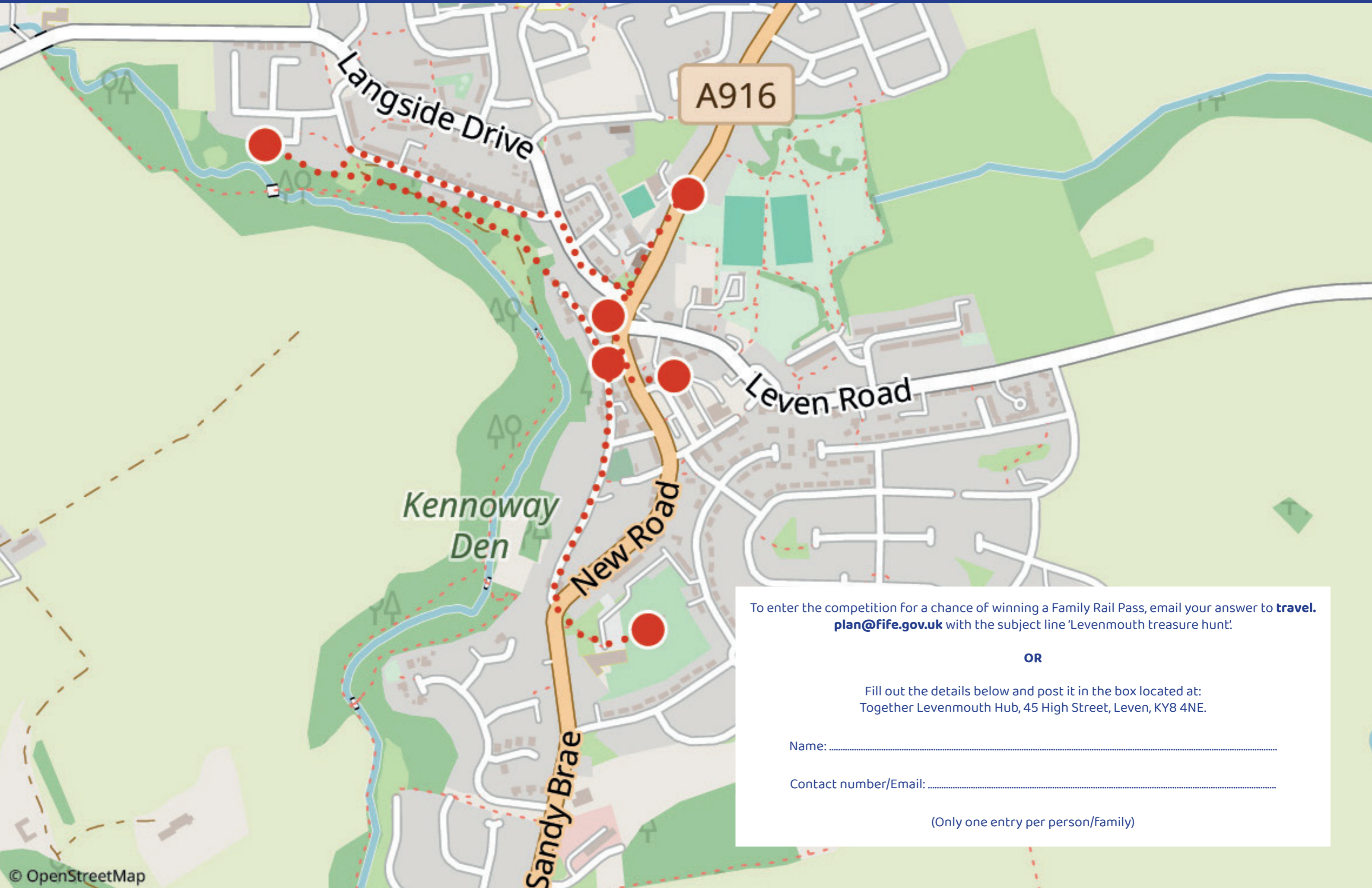
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WEMYSS VILLAGES

Embark on a journey through history and beauty as you explore the three charming villages of East Wemyss, West Wemyss, and Coaltown of Wemyss. Your adventure will take you past historic landmarks, natural wonders, and hidden gems with one thing in common. The Railway!

Collect all the numerical clues at each point which will help you unravel the mystery of this trail, e.g $2024 = 2+0+2+4 = 8$, the 8th letter of the alphabet is H.

Clue 1:

Start your adventure at West Wemyss. Navigate your way to Wemyss Docks. Search the car park area for a clue hidden in the notices of the Fife Coastal Path. Your first letter can be found by adding up the last six digits of the telephone number.

Clue 2:

Keep track of time as you pass by the Tower Clock. Its coat of arms may be in disrepair but look for the yellow sign for your next clue. This one is tricky as you need to add the top number to the existing letter to get the letter required.

Clue 3:

Make your way to the peaceful surroundings of the Wemyss Cemetery. At the memorial of those who lost their lives trying to save the village from a floating sea mine. Your next letter can be found by adding the 1st, 2nd and 4th digits together.

Clue 4:

Dander along the coastal path to where you first started before moving on to finding out about the history of Coaltown of Wemyss – but before you go, your last clue is prominent on the old Belvedere Hotel a few steps up the hill from your start point. Add up the numbers then split them into two to find the two missing letters.

Clue 5:

Discover the artistry of Wemyss Needlework in Coaltown of Wemyss. Look for a hidden clue on the sign with the Swan. The first two numbers will give you, your next letter.

Clue 6:

Pay your respects at the War Monument. This solemn memorial honours the brave men and women who sacrificed their lives for their country. Search around the monument area for a time that paid its respect to those

who lived and worked in the village. My clue is the first digit of this decade.

Clue 7:

Your journey will continue to the village of East Wemyss at the site that pays its respect to the disaster that rocked its foundations and changed the lives of those who lived there. What a year that was!

Clue 8:

Next, head to the site that is dedicated to Sir Jimmy Shand, you will find your clue within this memorial. Remove the duplicated numbers in his birthdate to solve the answer to my next clue.

Clue 9:

Your adventure continues along the coast to Weavers Court where you may sit for a moment and continue to soak in the sounds of the sea, from this park bench your next clue can be seen. My clue is held within the first date.

Clue 10:

Finally stroll back up to the centre of the village, admiring the many tributes to bygone ages, to the memorial of Lt. Commander Wilfred Neville Waller and the remembrance seat to our late Queen. The answer lies in my 1st and 3rd digit.

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
